Jeff Lipinski opened the Budget Adoption meeting for 2023 Budget.

Jeff Lipinski read the figures for the 2023 Budget. Adopted budget is \$924,304.00 with a tax levy of \$389,211.00 and tax rate of 1.2622. Adopted budget for home-ruled funds are \$364,596.00. Total for the budget is \$1,288,900. Pat Reel made a motion to adopt the 2023 budget figures as read. Myrna Claar seconded, and the motion carried with Pat, Myrna, and Don voting for passage.

There were no comments from the council or guests.

Minutes from the September meeting were approved.

Treasurer's Report – Megan Reel gave written reports. Megan said the SBOA audit was now complete. There was a distribution on 6/14/2021 that was put in the Local Roads and Street Fund in error in the amount of \$1,985.63, and it should have been put in the MVH Restricted Fund. This has been corrected. There were a couple of things fixed on the 2021 AFR (Annual Financial Report). Most of the rest was to do with internal controls, the council is helping to rectify these things by signing and double checking, starting August 2022.

Streets/Wastewater – Don Parvin said he didn't think there was anything to report.

Marshal's Dept. – Josh Fulkerson left a written report. Pat Reel said Josh would not be here as he has had training all week.

EMA Advisory – Pat Reel said nothing new that he knew of.

Attorney Comments – Corbin King asked about redistricting wards. He asked if the council still wanted districts or if they wanted to do away with them. He usually asks after the census comes out every 10 years. The council thought we should keep the districts to represent different areas of the town.

Corbin asked about the piece of property between the library and 312 N. East St. Megan said she talked to the library and the homeowner and they were both aware of what Corbin suggested at the previous meeting.

Bob Rutherford was present and wanted to buy part of the land at the New London plant site. Corbin will look into this and work on what could be done legally and the easiest way for everyone involved.

Don Parvin asked Corbin about the agreement with Roger Carter. Corbin said it was voted on at the last meeting and he is working on it.

Plan Commission – No one was present to report.
